AWARD

(Passed on 3rd May, 2012)

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (14 of 1947) (for short the Act) the Government of Goa by order dated 23-5-11 bearing number 28/7/2011-Lab has referred the following dispute for adjudication by this Tribunal.

“(1) Whether the action of the management of M/s. Colgate Palmolive (India) Limited, Kundaim, Goa, in dismissing from services Shri Satyawhan Gaude, Operator, with effect from 30-04-2010 is legal and justified?

(2) If not, what relief the Workman is entitled to?”

2. On receipt of the reference, a case was registered under No. IT/9/11 and registered A. D. notices were issued to the parties. In pursuance to the said notices Adv. Suhas Naik appeared for Party I and Adv. M. S. Bandodkar appeared for Party II and accordingly the matter was fixed for filing of the statement of claim by the Party I.

3. Records reveal that despite granting several opportunities which is almost eight opportunities, the advocate representing Party I did not file the statement of claim and on the further date of hearing i.e. on 28-3-12 neither Party I nor his advocate remained present before the Court though Shri M. S. Bandodkar representing Party II was present. The matter was accordingly fixed for filing of the claim statement on 30-4-12 however, even on this date neither Party I nor his advocate appeared. Learned advocate for Party II made it clear that he has no written statement to be filed and accordingly the matter was fixed for award.

4. It may mentioned here that the reference of the dispute has been made by the State Government at the instance of the Workman. The action of the management dismissing the Workman from the services w.e.f. 30-4-2010 has been challenged by the Workman by raising the Industrial Dispute. It is a settled law that if a Party challenges the legality of an order, the burden lies upon him to prove the illegality of the order. It was therefore incumbent upon the Workman to have appeared and substantiated his allegation that the action of the management in dismissing him from services was illegal and unjustified.

5. In the above context reference is made to the judgment in the case of **V. K. Raj Industries v/s Labour Court (1) and others 1981 (29) F.L.R.**

194 wherein the Allahabad High Court has held as under.

“The proceedings before the industrial Court are judicial in nature, even though the Indian Evidence Act does not apply to the proceedings but the principle underlying the said Act is applicable to the proceedings before the Industrial Court. In a judicial proceeding if no evidence is produced the party challenging the validity of the order must fail. It is well settled that if a party challenges the legality of an order, the burden lies upon him to prove illegality of the order and if no evidence is produced, the party invoking jurisdiction of the Court must fail.”

6. The observations in the above judgment also indicate that if the Workman fails to appear or to file written statement or to produce evidence, the dispute referred by the State Government cannot be answered in favour of the Workman and he would not be entitled to any relief.

7. In the instant case, as stated by me above, the dispute was referred by the State Government at the instance of the Workman and therefore the burden was on the Workman to prove that the action of management of dismissing him from the service was illegal and unjustified. However, the Workman did not file the statement of claim nor produced any evidence as a result of which, there is no material before this Court to hold that the order of dismissal passed by the management is illegal and unjustified. In the circumstances, I hold that the Workman has failed to prove that the action of the management in dismissing him from services w.e.f. 30-04-2010 is illegal and unjustified and hence I pass the following:

ORDER

1. It is hereby held that the action of the management of M/s. Colgate Palmolive (India) Limited, Kundaim, Goa, in dismissing Shri Satyawar Gaude, Operator from services, with effect from 30-04-2010 is legal and justified.
2. No order as to costs.

AWARD

(Passed on 12th day of April, 2012)

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (Central of 1947) (for short the Act) the Government of Goa by order dated 10-11-2011 bearing No. 28/41/2011-Lab has referred the following dispute for adjudication by this Tribunal.

- “(1) Whether Shri Joseph D'Costa, Junior Human Resource Executive, could be construed as a “Workman” as defined under clause (s) of Section 2 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (Central Act 14 of 1947)?
- (2) If the answer to issue No. (1) above is in affirmative, then, whether the action of the management of Whispering Palm Beach Resort Private Limited, Candolim, Bardez-Goa, in terminating the services of

Shri Joseph D'Costa, Junior Human Resource Executive, with effect from 31-03-2010, is legal and justified?

- (3) If the answer to issue No. (2) above is in the negative, then, to what relief the Workman is entitled?"

2. On receipt of the reference, IT/40/11 was registered. Notices were issued to both the parties. The notice issued to Party I returned with postal remark as "not known return to sender". Adv. Shri A. Kundaikar appeared on behalf of Party II. A fresh notice was then issued to Party I under certificate of posting but even this notice was not claimed by Party I as it returned with the postal remark "unclaimed return to sender".

3. The reference of the dispute has been made by the State Government at the instance of the Workman. The order of the employer in terminating the services of the Workman w.e.f. 31-3-2010 is challenged by the Workman by raising Industrial Dispute which has been referred to this Tribunal by the State Government for adjudication.

4. It is settled law that if a party challenged the legality of an order, the burden lies upon him to prove the illegality of the order. It was, therefore incumbent upon the Workman to have appeared and substantiated his allegation that his termination from services by the employer w.e.f. 31-3-10 was not legal and justified. Reliance is placed on the judgment in **V. K. Raj Industries v/s Labour Court (1) and others 1981 (29) F.L.L. R. 194** in which it is observed as under:

"The proceedings before the industrial Court are judicial in nature, even though the Indian Evidence Act does not apply to the proceedings but the principle underlying the said Act is applicable to the proceeding before the Industrial Court. In a judicial proceeding if no evidence is produced the party challenging the validity of the order must fail. It is well settled that if a party challenges the legality of an order, the burden lies upon him to prove illegality of the order and if no evidence is produced, the party invoking jurisdiction of the Court must fail."

5. It is also observed in this judgment that if the Workman fails to appear or file the written statement or produced the evidence, the dispute referred by the State Government cannot be answered in favour of the Workman and he would not be entitled to any relief.

6. As stated in the preceding paras, the dispute in this case was referred by the State Government at the instance of the Workman and therefore the burden was on the Workman to prove that his termination by Party II was illegal and unjustified which, the Workman failed to prove and as a result there is no material before me to hold that the said order of termination of services issued by the employer, is illegal and unjustified.

7. In the circumstances, I hold that the Workman has failed to prove that the action of the employer in terminating his services w.e.f. 31-3-10 is illegal and unjustified and hence I pass the following.

ORDER

1. It is hereby held that the action of the management of M/s. Whispering Palm Beach Resort Private Limited, Candolim, Bardez-Goa in terminating the services of Shri Joseph D'Costa, Junior Human Resource Executive with effect from 31-03-2010, is legal and justified.

2. There shall be no order as to costs.
