AWARD

In exercise of the powers conferred by Clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (Central Act 14 of 1947), the Government of Goa, by order dated 05-08-2009 bearing No. 28/20/2008-LAB referred the following dispute for adjudication to the Industrial Tribunal of Goa. The Presiding Officer, Industrial Tribunal-cum-Labour Court thereafter assigned the present reference to the Labour Court-II for its adjudication.

"(1) Whether the action of the management of M/s. Goa State Co-operative Bank Ltd." Panaji-Goa in terminating the services of Shri Uday S. Vast, Peon, with effect from 26-06-2008, is legal and justified?

(2) If not, what relief, the Workman is entitled to?"

2. On receipt of the reference, a case was registered under No. LC-II/IT/03/09 and registered A/D notice was issued to the parties. In pursuance to the said notice, the parties put in their appearance. The Workman/Party I (for short 'Workman'), filed his statement of claim on 20-10-2009 at Exb. 5. The facts of the case in brief as pleaded by the Workman are that he was appointed by the Employer/Party II (for short "Employer") as a 'Trainee Peon' for six months

somewhere in September, 1996 after having been interviewed and after completion of other procedural formalities. He stated that he was subsequently appointed as a 'Peon' in regular service by the Employer and was given the scales and other benefits as applicable to the said post. He stated that the Employer Bank started harassing & victimizing him for the reasons best known to them. He stated that though he was working as a 'Peon', he was transferred from one place to another without any genuine reason. He stated that due to harassment, victimization and mental torture by the Employer, he became a victim of hypertension, asthma & kidney stone etc. at a very young age of his life and had to remain sometime absent for medical treatment. He stated that he was compelled to remain absent sometimes without prior sanction of leave or information/permission of the Employer. He stated that he used to inform the Employer about his absence either on phone or through messages. He stated that on 21-04-2008, while on duty at Caranzalem Branch, he suffered from a severe attack of hypertension and asthma and as such he had to leave the office for urgent medical treatment. He stated that he had obtained the permission of his superior while leaving the branch and took medical treatment from Dr. Gopal Kudchadkar, Panaji-Goa. He stated that his doctor advised him to take complete rest and as such he could not report for his duties from the said day. He stated that since he was taking allopathic treatment for hypertension and asthma attack, it affected his body and he suffered from a kidney stone problem. He stated that he could not report for his duties because of his aforesaid sickness, however he informed his superior authority from time to time about his sickness and doctor's treatment. He stated that after recovering from the said sickness, he had informed the authorities about his sickness and also submitted his medical certificate. He stated that when he went to report for his duties, he was refused to allow to report for duties stating that his services has been terminated by the Employer Bank. He stated that he has however not received any communication about the alleged termination of service. He stated that neither he was issued any charge-sheet nor conducted any enquiry or considered his genuine sickness while terminating his services. He submitted that his services have been abruptly terminated in violation of principles of natural justice, while he was sick and under medical treatment. He submitted that the Employer Bank has also failed to comply the statutory requirement as required under the

provisions of I.D. Act, 1947. He submitted that he had completed more than 240 days of service during the preceding 12 months from the termination of his service. He submitted that the Employer Bank has failed to pay him notice in lieu of pay, retrenchment compensation nor complied with the provisions of Sec. 25-F of the I. D. Act., 1947. He therefore contended that the termination of his service is ab initio, bad in law. He submitted that he is unemployed from the date of his termination and could not succeed in getting an employment though he had tried his level best. He submitted that the entire action on the part of the Employer Bank in terminating his service is illegal, unjustified, bad in law and in violation of principles of natural justice. He therefore prayed for his reinstatement with full back wages and continuity in service.

3. The Employer Bank filed its written statement on 17-03-2010 at Exb. 06. The Employer resisted the claim of the Workman preliminarily on the ground that no "Industrial Dispute" exists as defined u/s 2(k) of the I. D. Act, 1947 and that the Party I had voluntarily abandoned his service. The Employer Bank submitted that the reference has been made by the Government without any material on record, in haste and without application of mind. The Employer however admitted that the Workman was in their employment since September, 1996 till 26-06-2008 which includes his probation period. The Employer stated that the Workman was a habitual absentee. The Employer stated that the Workman did not report for his duty and abandoned his service without serving any notice to it, thus put them in hardship and trouble. The Employer stated that they waited for the Workman till 26-06-2008 and thereafter via its letter No. GSCB/ADM/2008-09/3737 dated 26-06-2008 informed the Workman that it has been presumed that he has voluntarily abandoned their job and he was further directed to take note that his services with them stands terminated with immediate effect. The Employer stated that the Workman has been absenting from duty of his own. The Employer stated that the Workman was issued a show cause as to why the disciplinary action should not be taken against him for his failure and gross negligence in not attending his duties properly. The Employer stated that the Workman instead of submitting any explanation either orally or otherwise, he failed to report for work thereafter without any intimation or reasonable cause. The Employer stated that they received intimation from the Office of the Assistant Labour Commissioner asking them to remain

present in its Office in connection with alleged illegal termination of services of the Workman. The Employer stated that it had explained to the Assistant Labour Commissioner vide its letter dated 08-01-2009 that the Workman had left the employment with them on his own and that it is the case of the voluntarily abandonment of the service. The Employer stated that the Workman did not work with integrity and ability as alleged by him. The Employer stated that the Workman was working as a temporary Workman and was prone to commit mistake in work and displaying negligence in the discharge of duties. The Employer stated that the Workman was therefore pulled up on several occasions for lack of interest in work and not following instructions scrupulously. The Employer stated that several written warnings were issued to the Workman and he was orally admonished on several occasions to improve. The Employer stated that the Workman had indulged in act of misconduct of absenteeism, gross negligence and it had not waived its right of taking action. The Employer submitted that since the Workman voluntarily abandoned the service, the question of issuing any charge-sheet or conducting, any enquiry did not arise. The Employer denied that it had not complied with the statutory requirements as envisaged under the provisions of I. D. Act, 1947. The Employer stated that inspite of reminders, the Workman failed to report for work and hence it presumed that he has voluntarily abandoned the service. The Employer denied that the Party I is unemployed from the date of his termination. The Employer finally prayed that the reference be rejected.

4. Thereafter, the Workman filed his re-joinder on 31-03-2010 at Exb. 6 -A. The Workman by way of re-joinder confirms and reiterates all his submissions, averments and statements made in his claim statement to be correct and proved and denied all the statements, averments and submissions made by the Employer Bank in its written statement which are contrary to his statement and averments made in his claim statement.

5. Thereafter on the basis of the pleadings filed by the respective parties this Court framed the following issues at Exb. 07.

1. *Whether the Party II proves that there is no industrial dispute exists as defined u/s 2(k) of the I. D. Act, 1947?*
2. *Whether the Party I proves that the action of the Party II in terminating his services w. e. f. 26-06-2008 is illegal and unjustified?*

3. *Whether the Party II proves that the Party I had voluntarily abandoned his services?*

4. *Whether the Party I is entitled for any relief?*

5. *What Order? What Award?*

6. Thereafter, the parties have produced and inspected the documents relied by them. The Party I thereafter led evidence oral as well as documentary by examining himself. After completion of the evidence of the Workman, the Employer filed and Affidavit-in-Evidence of its General Manager, Shri Kisan Mayekar and also produced on record certain documents through its aforesaid witness and the case was adjourned to 16-10-2012 for further examination in chief of the said Employer's witness on 16-10-2012, Ld. Advocate for both the parties respective remained present and the case was adjourned to 01-11-2012 at the request of Ld. Adv. Shri P. Chawdikar for the Employer. On 01-11-2012 Ld. Advocates for both the parties respectively remained present and orally submitted that the matter is likely to be settled amicably between the parties and sought time to file the consent term. Accordingly, the Workman alongwith his Adv. Shri S. K. Manjrekar as well as the General Manager of the Employer alongwith Ld. Adv. Shri P. Chawdikar appeared before me on 05-11-2012 and filed a joint application dated 05-11-2012 for award in terms of settlement at Exb. 22, duly signed by the parties alongwith their respective advocates on record.

I have carefully perused the said terms of settlements at Exb. 22 and I am satisfied that the said terms of settlement are certainly beneficial to the Workman. It also helps in keeping peaceful harmonious industrial relations between the parties. I therefore, accept the submissions made by the parties and pass the consent awards in terms of settlement dated 05-11-2012 at Exb. 22.

ORDER

1. It is agreed between the parties to settle the dispute amicably by reinstating the Party I in the services of the Party II in continuity of his employment.
2. It is agreed that the Party I shall not claim the back wages from the Party II. The Party II will issue appropriate letter to the Party I reinstating him immediately after disposal of the present reference.

3. The Party I, Shri Uday Vast states that he is having no claim of whatsoever nature which can be computed in terms of money against the Employer and that he does not wish to pursue the present reference and treat the said reference as settled in view of compliance of Clause Nos. 1 & 2 of the said application for award in terms of settlement.
4. That in view of the amicable settlement between the parties hereto, the Dispute as to "Whether the action of the Management of M/s. Goa State Co-operative Bank Ltd., Panaji, in terminating the services of Shri Uday S. Vast, 'Peon' with effect from 26-06-2008, is legal and justified?", does not survive.
4. No order as to costs.
5. Inform the Government accordingly.
