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Proceeding No. 78/2013

Inquiry Report

The Complainant is the mother of Shri Jayesh Naik, who is an under trial prisoner presently lodged in Judicial Lock-up at Mapusa. Initially, he was lodged in Sub-Jail, Sada at Vasco on 17-02-2011 along with other 8 co-accused who are facing trial before Sessions Court at Margao-Goa. The records indicate that the Assistant Superintendent, Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco by letter dated 04-11-2011 requested the Inspector General of Prisons, Panaji to transfer the said under trial prisoner Shri Jayesh Naik to any other jail on the ground that the said under trial was instigating other inmates at

Sub-Jail, Sada and was forming groups in Jail. Acting upon the said request, the Inspector General of Prisons, Panaji transferred Shri Jayesh Naik from Sub-Jail-cum-Judicial Lock-up, Sada to Judicial Lock-up at Mapusa.

2. The Complainant has stated that this Commission after visiting the Judicial Lock-up at Mapusa, recommended the transfer of Shri Jayesh Naik back to Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco. She has further stated that the recommendation of this Commission was not acted upon by the Office of IGP, Panaji in respect of Shri Jayesh Naik. However, about 20 inmates were transferred from Mapusa to Vasco. She has further stated that it is very difficult for her family members, specially old and sick parents, wife of Jayesh and their two children to travel from Margao to Mapusa to meet the under trial prisoner. It is further stated that the Trial Court is situated in Margao and her son Jayesh Naik is not getting enough opportunity to defend himself as he cannot meet his lawyer. The Complainant has pleaded that her son Jayesh Naik may be transferred back to Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco.

3. The Respondent/Inspector General of Prisons, Panaji in his reply has stated that the under trial prisoner Shri Jayesh Naik was transferred to Judicial Lock-Up, Mapusa upon the request of the Superintendent, Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco. It is further stated that it was not advisable to transfer the under trial prisoner Shri Jayesh Naik back to Vasco in view of his behaviour which is detrimental to the smooth functioning of the jail as reported by the Superintendent.

4. The Assistant Superintendent, Sub-Jail, Vasco has also filed reply stating therein among other things that he received several oral complaints from jail staff and other co-inmates starting that the said Shri Jayesh Naik was planning to form groups among the inmates and to create unrest in the jail. He has further stated that it was noticed that Shri Jayesh Naik used to instigate his room-mates to go against the system in all aspects and file baseless allegations against jail administration. This Commission also recorded the statement of Shri Bhanudas Pednekar, Assistant Superintendent of Jail, Sada, Vasco. In his statement before this Commission, Shri Bhanudas Pednekar has stated that since there was a previous enmity between Shri Jayesh Naik and another co-accused Shri Sandeep Kalangutkar, Shri Jayesh Naik along with other accused has attempted to hurt him and were torturing him as Shri Sandeep Kalangutkar was doing good work in art industry and giving training to other inmates.

5. Incidentally, this Commission had earlier paid surprise visit to the Judicial Lock-Up at Mapusa and had interviewed three prisoners at Lock-Up Cells on 25-02-2013. During the course of the interview, Shri Jayesh Naik made a grievance before the Commission that he was transferred as he was protesting about the appalling conditions existing in the Sub-Jail, Sada. He stated before us that he hails from Margao and therefore it would be difficult for his family members as well as his Advocate to meet him as often as required because of long distance. Considering the difficulties faced by Shri Jayesh Naik, the Commission had recommended that the said prisoner Shri Jayesh Naik should be transferred back to Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco or any other Judicial Lock-Up at Margao-Goa.

6. Since the Jail Administration of Sada Jail has transferred Shri Jayesh Naik, allegedly on account of enmity between two groups, this Commission directed the Under Secretary of this Commission to pay a visit to Sub-Jail, Vasco in order to ascertain whether Shri Jayesh Naik can be transferred back to the Sub-Jail, Sada without disturbing harmonious relations of the prisoners in the Jail premises. Accordingly, the Under Secretary paid visit to Sub-Jail, Sada on 06-01-2014 and submitted his report along with a sketch of Jail premises indicating the position of the Cells.

7. We have perused the records of this case. We have also heard the Parties.

8. The Complainant in her statement in writing dated 07-10-2013 has stated that her son Shri Jayesh Naik was instrumental in highlighting the problems relating to poor quality of food problems relating to sanitation, drinking water, playground facilities, etc. He also brought to the notice of the Sessions Judge of Margao about the poor quality of food and the Sessions Judge assured him of reporting the matter to the High Court which caused annoyance to Shri Pednekar, Assistant Superintendent of Jail.

9. On the basis of the records of this case, it can be safely inferred that Shri Pednekar, the Assistant Superintendent of Jail did not like the above behaviour of Shri Jayesh Naik. The records also indicate that Shri Jayesh Naik was trying to expose the irregularities allegedly prevailing in the Jail Administration of Sub-Jail, Sada and hence the Assistant Superintendent of Jail recommended the transfer of Shri Jayesh Naik from Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco which was mechanically accepted by the Inspector General of Prisons, Panaji-Goa.

10. It may be noted that Shri Jayesh Naik hails from Margao and his family members consisting of his wife, two children and old parents are staying at Margao. He is facing trial before the Sessions Court at Margao. On account of his transfer at Judicial Lock-Up, Mapusa, he is not able to meet his lawyer from time to time who is defending his case. His family members are also finding it difficult to visit him at Mapusa in view of long distance. The ground on which the Assistant Superintendent of Jail has recommended the transfer of Shri Jayesh Naik from Sub-Jail, Sada is not convincing. We are satisfied that the family members of Shri Jayesh Naik are facing lot of difficulties to visit him at Judicial Lock-Up at Mapusa. The apprehension of Jail Administration that Shri Jayesh Naik is planning to form groups among the inmates to create unrest in the Jail is misplaced and without any basis. Article-21 of the Constitution of India guarantees every person including an under trial prisoner the right to lead a life with dignity and not a mere animal existence. An under trial prisoner apart from having the expectation, nay, right of meeting his family members, is expected to interact with his Advocate as frequently as possible in order to defend himself properly. Any unjustified curb on such right and liberty is violation of his right to life and liberty guaranteed under Article-21 of the Constitution. The circumstances under which Shri Jayesh Naik has been shifted to Judicial Lock-Up at Mapusa, in our opinion is infringement of his fundamental right guaranteed under Article-21 of Constitution of India and also amounts to violation of human rights. The Inspector General of Prisons was not justified ignoring the request of Shri Jayesh Naik to transfer him back to Sub-Jail at Sada. Even the earlier recommendation of this Commission has been dealt with in a cavalier manner.

11. We are therefore inclined to make following recommendations:

Shri Jayesh Naik, the under trial prisoner should be transferred back to Sub-Jail at Sada, Vasco without any further delay.

The Inspector General of Prisons, Panaji-Goa shall forward its comments on the report including action taken or proposed to be taken thereon in terms of Section 18 (e) of the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 to this Commission on 11-02-2014.

A copy of this Report including the recommendations shall be forwarded to the State Government, through Chief Secretary for necessary action.

**Action taken and comments on inquiry
report dated 10-1-2014**

By inquiry report dated 10-1-2014, the Hon'ble Commission has made the following recommendation:

"Shri Jayesh Naik, the under trial prisoner should be transferred back to Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco without any further delay".

1. Further, it has been stated that "the Inspector General of Prisons shall forward its comments on the report including action taken or proposed to be taken thereon in terms of Section 18 (e) of the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 to this Commission on 11-02-2014".

2. Pursuant to the recommendation of this Hon'ble Commission, the under trial prisoner Jayesh Naik has been transferred back to Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco vide order No. 13/1/99-IGP/(PF)/Vol.II/177 dated 6-2-2014. Copy of the order is annexed hereto and marked as **Exhibit 'R-1'**.

3. Having complied with the order, we would also like to bring the following points to the notice of this Hon'ble Commission:

(i) It is stated that Jayesh Naik is undergoing trial alongwith eight other co-accused in the headless murder case. The names of these other co-accused are (1) Sandeep Kalangutkar, (2) Vivek Dhumkale, (3) Govind Naik, (4) Rashikant Gawas, (5) Nitin Bhonsle, (6) Krishna Anchoti, (7) Rajesh Naik and (8) Nitin Dicholkar. Except for Rajesh Naik and Nitin Dicholkar who have been released on bail due to medical grounds, all the others are still undergoing trial.

(ii) It is reported that there are two groups within the co-accused. In fact, Jayesh Naik was removed from Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco, because of this groupism and resultant rivalry. A copy of the letter dated 4-11-2011 received from the Assistant Superintendent, Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco is annexed hereto and marked as **Exhibit 'R-2'**.

(iii) It is pertinent to mention here that the co-accused Sandeep Kalangutkar is separated from the other co-accused who are reportedly led by Jayesh Naik. Sandeep Kalangutkar is separated and lodged in Cell No. 6, whereas others are lodged in Cell No. 15 and 7. It is further pertinent to note that Sandeep Kalangutkar is having a separate advocate, whereas the others are having the same advocate to defend their case.

(iv) The co-accused Sandeep Kalangutkar is reported to be facing a threat from the other co-accused led by Jayesh Naik. In this regard, there is representation dated 27-1-2014 addressed to Inspector General of Prisons by Sandeep Kalangutkar upon hearing the news that this Hon'ble Commission has ordered his transfer back to Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco. Copy of this representation written in Hindi forwarded by the Superintendent, Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco vide his letter No. SJSV/14//2014/2890 dated 27-1-2014 with his comments is annexed hereto and marked as **Exhibit 'R-3'**.

4. Considering the concern raised by Sandeep Kalangutkar in his representation, this office would like to reserve the right to remove Jayesh Naik to other Jails/Lock-up, if it is found that Jayesh Naik is responsible for disturbances if any that may take place in Sub-Jail, Sada, Vasco.

The accused Sandeep Kalangutkar has stated in his application that there is threat to his life from Jayesh Naik and other co-accused mentioned above since he has engaged separate advocate to defend his case and others are having same advocate. Sandeep Kalangutkar has also stated that earlier on two occasions Jayesh Naik has attempted to attack him in the Jail. In this regard, you are earnestly requested to consider the written request of the prisoner Sandeep Kalangutkar appropriately and decide on humanitarian grounds.

४. अब जयेश बाहर से गौरेश नायक को कह कर बाहर मेरे पहचान वाले को धमकी दे रहा है कि छुटकर आने के बाद हम संदीप के टुकडे २ करेगे तो मेरी फ़ैमिली घबराकर पोलीस कम्प्लेन्ट करनेवाली थी लेकिन मैंने फ़ैमिली को रोका कि हमें यह सब परेशानी नहीं चाहिए। इसके बाद ४-१-२०१४ को मेरा कोर्ट था तो गोरेश नायक कोर्ट में जयेश को मिलने आया था तब मैंने गोरेश नायक को पुछा कि मेने सुना है कि तुम जयेश के साथ मिलकर मुझे मारने वाले हो क्या यह सच है तैसे उसने जवाब में कहा कि तू सिर्फ बाहर निकल हम तुझे दिखाते है और हमारी मुह जबानी बहस हुयी तो उधर हम लोगो को पोलिस एस्कोर्ड ने रोका अगर आप चाहे तो पोलीस एस्कोर्ड और जज के पास जो पोलीस बैठता है उससे पुछताछ कर सकते है।

May it Please Your Honour

In view of the directions given by the Hon'ble Commission in the above mentioned matter, it is submitted that the undersigned, the Chief Secretary of Goa, would like to place the following before the Hon'ble Commission.

There is a procedure in place under powers delegated to the District Magistrate which ensures that whenever such permission to use the road for film shooting or for that matter closure of road is granted various conditions are imposed including that no inconvenience should be caused to the general public and its bounden duty of the traffic police and the other police officials who are directed to maintain smooth flow of traffic so also to ensure that no law and order problem is created.

Guidelines to be followed during film shooting in the jurisdiction of Corporation of the City of Panaji are Exhibit at "A".

ESG shall incorporate in their terms & conditions while granting the permission for film shooting etc., to ensure that appropriate signanges are erected and road closure if required, would be permitted to be done after obtaining necessary permission of the local police, the concerned traffic cell, District Magistrate/Collector in accordance with law as also that police personnel would have to be requisitioned and obtained to ensure proper maintenance of law and order.

All Sub-Divisional Police Officers, Superintendents of Police, Police Inspector, Panaji Town Police Station are instructed to take proper safety measures that the public members are not affected

while using the public roads, even if the film producers engage services of security personnel's, "Bouncers" the staff deployed for such bandobast/protection at site for law and order duty are directed that no hurdles are created to the members of public while using the public roads. All the said authorities including CEO-ESG & Commissioner, CCP, are also instructed that, at henceforth, to take proper safety measures for public members, while granting permission for film shootings on public roads and shall ensure that such incidents are not repeated in future.

CEO-ESG has been cautioned that no permission for film shooting be granted to any production company without obtaining all the required NOC's from the concerned authorities as well as the order for using the road or closure of the road for film shooting at least 15 days in advance.

In future one of the Executive Magistrate of the area concerned will be posted to oversee the film shooting vis-a-vis the obstacle-free movement of members of public.

Inquiry Report

Taking Suo Motu cognizance of the media reports appearing in the Times of India dated 26-06-2013 and Navhind Times dated 26-06-2013 relating to the incident of alleged assault on Dr. Oscar Rebello, this Commission issued notices to 1) State of Goa represented by the Chief Secretary, Secretariat, Porvorim-Goa 2) Secretary (Transport), Secretariat, Porvorim-Goa 3) Director General of Police, Panaji-Goa and 4) Commissioner, Corporation of the City of Panaji to find out about the extent and nature of permission which was granted to the Producer of the film for shooting on public roads and whether the grant of permission to shoot the film on a public road should curtail the right of a citizen to use the road. It was made clear that this Commission does not intend to enter into the question of assault or otherwise as the same is the subject matter of investigation by the police.

2. In pursuance to the notices of this Commission, the Respondent Nos. 2, 3 and 4 filed their respective replies.

3. The Respondent No. 2 in its reply has stated that the Department of Transport is not the authority to grant permission for cinema shoot in public place. It is further stated that the closure of any road permanently or temporarily is authorised by the District Magistrate. Respondent No. 2 has also stated that the regulation of traffic or temporary closure of any road for vehicular traffic is regulated by the Traffic Police in accordance with the situation prevalent at the concerned place and time.

4. The Respondent No. 3 has stated that as far as the nature of permission which was granted to the Producer of film shooting is concerned, the Superintendent of Police, North Goa received reference from Entertainment Society of Goa on 21-06-2013 requesting to give say NOC/permission for film shooting to Abdul Rehman Sheikh of PNF Productions which was scheduled on 23rd and 28th June, 2013. The reference was forwarded to Panaji Police Station for comments through SDPO, Panaji. It is stated that since Panaji Police received the said reference on 24-06-2013 evening i.e. after the film shoot started no comments were offered. It is also stated that NOC for the film shoot was issued by Entertainment Society of Goa and City Corporation of Panaji without obtaining/waiting for NOC from police.

5. The Respondent No. 4 has stated that the Respondent has framed guidelines to be followed during film shooting in the jurisdiction of Corporation of the City of Panaji, and that NOC was granted in terms of the guidelines framed by the Respondent No. 4.

6. By letter dated 19-06-2013, Shri Abdul Rehman, PNF Productions, requested the Chief Executive Officer, Entertainment Society of Goa to grant permission for film shooting for the period from 23-06-2013 to 28-06-2013 at Junction Road near Old GMC Complex, Urban Health Centre Building, Panaji and INOX Entrance road which leads to the new Municipal Market. By letter dated 19-06-2013, the Entertainment Society of Goa sent the said letter of PNF Productions to 1) Superintendent of Police (North), Porvorim-Goa, 2) Commissioner, Corporation of the City of Panaji and 3) The Office of the Collector (North), Collectorate Building, Panaji-Goa calling upon them to give their say in the matter. By letter dated 21-06-2013, the Corporation of the City of Panaji gave no objection for shooting the film subject to the conditions stated therein.

7. We have perused the media reports and also the replies filed by the Respondent No. 2, 3 and 4. We have also heard the Parties. The guidelines framed by the Respondent No. 4 indicate that permissions are required to be taken from Panaji Town Police, Panaji Traffic Police Cell and District Magistrate (North) as well as the Corporation of the City of Panaji. The records of this case clearly indicate that permission for shooting was granted without NOC from Panaji Town Police, Panaji Traffic Police Cell and also the District Magistrate (North).

8. On the basis of media reports it can be gathered that the Security Personnel commonly known as "Bouncers" of PNF Productions allegedly prevented Dr. Oscar Rebello when he was crossing the road. The concerned authorities ought to have considered that the right of a citizen cannot be curtailed to use the public roads. It is therefore necessary that the concerned authorities should ensure that the public members are not affected while using the public roads even in case permission is granted for film shooting on public roads. Even if the film producers engage services of Security Personnels, the police personnels present at the site on law & order duty should ensure that no hurdles are created to the members of public while using the public road.

9. This Commission therefore recommends that the concerned authorities should take proper safety measures to the members of the public while granting permission for film shootings on public roads and shall ensure that such incidents are not repeated in future.

10. Action taken report or proposed to be taken by the State Government shall be submitted to this Commission on 04-02-2014.

GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED DURING FILM SHOOTING IN THE JURISDICTION OF CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF PANAJI

1. Film shooting on main roads will be allowed only on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.

2. Any interior roads sought for filming can be considered on any other day after proper inspection and analysis of the size of the film shoot.

9. All permission issued by Panaji Town Police, Panaji Traffic Police Cell and District Magistrate (North), as well as the Corporation of the City of Panaji should be kept handy at the location of the shoot for inspection by any official of the Corporation.
10. The parking of vehicles pertaining to the film shoot will be allowed at the following locations:-
 1. Below Mandovi Bridge.
 2. Service road in front of old G.M.C. building.
 3. Lane adjacent to Garcia de Orta Garden at Church Square.
 4. Miramar Circle.
 5. Lane adjacent to Kala Academy.
 6. Parade Ground.
