In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 read with articles 227 and 234 of the constitution of India and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor of Goa, in consultation with the High Court of Bombay and the Goa Public Service Commission, hereby makes the following rules, for introduction and implementation of the scheme of Evening Courts in the State of Goa, namely:—

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (1) These rules may be called the Goa Evening Courts Rules, 2014.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. *Definitions.*— In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) “Court” means the Court under the control of the High Court;

(b) “evening Court” means the Court which will function during evening hours from 5.30 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.;

(c) “Government” means the Government of Goa;

(d) “High Court” means the High Court of Bombay;

(e) “Judge” means a serving Judicial Officer or a retired Judicial Officer appointed under these rules to preside over the evening Court;

(f) “member of staff of Court” means any person or employee working in the Court.

3. *Jurisdiction of evening Court.*— The evening Court shall have jurisdiction to entertain and

try all kinds of cases, suits or other proceedings as may be assigned by the Principal District Judge, Principal Judge or Chief Judicial Magistrate, as the case may be.

4. *Appointment of Judge for evening Court.*— (1) The High Court may appoint, depute or transfer any serving Judicial Officer as a Judge of evening Court.

(2) The Government may, in consultation with the High Court, appoint any retired Judicial Officer as a Judge of evening Court:

Provided that, no person shall be appointed or act as a Judge of evening Court after he has completed sixty-seven years of age.

5. *Appointment of staff of the evening Court.*— (1) The principal District Judge, Principal Judge or Chief Judicial Magistrate, at the station, as the case may be, may appoint any serving member of the staff of Court to be a member of the staff of the evening Court.

(2) The Principal District Judge, Principal Judge or Chief Judicial Magistrate may appoint any retired member of the staff of the Court to be a member of the staff of the evening Court:

Provided that, no person shall be appointed or work as a member of the staff of the evening Court after he has completed sixty-two years of age.

(3) The number of the staff of each evening Court shall not exceed four that is, one Sheristedar or one who is holding a post not higher than that of the Sheristedar, one Stenographer (Lower Grade), one Clerk-Typist and one Peon.

6. *Notification of evening Court.*— The High Court may notify as many Courts to be the evening Courts as required under these rules, not exceeding the number of the evening Courts notified by the Government.

7. *Working hours of evening Court.*— All evening Courts shall sit everyday, except on holidays, during the period from 5.30 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.

8. *Remuneration.*— Remuneration of evening Court Judge and member of staff of the evening Court shall be as under:—

(i) Where the serving Judicial Officer is appointed to preside over the evening Court, he shall be paid *two per cent per day* of his admissible gross salary as an additional pay.

(ii) Where a retired Judicial Officer is appointed as an evening Court Judge, he shall be paid *two per cent per day* of his last drawn gross salary as was admissible to him prior to his retirement.

(iii) Where a serving member of the staff of Court is appointed as a member of staff of evening Court, he shall receive twenty per cent of his admissible gross salary as additional pay.

(iv) Where a retired member of the staff of Court is appointed as a member of staff of the evening Court, he shall be paid twenty per cent of his last drawn gross salary as was admissible to him prior to his retirement.

9. *Supervision and control.*— Subject to the overall control of the High Court, the Principal District Judge, Principal Judge or Chief Judicial Magistrate at the station, as the case may be, shall supervise and monitor the functioning of the evening Courts.

10. *Termination of service.*— The services of the Judge of evening Court appointed under sub-rule (2) of rule 4 and a member of staff of evening Court appointed under sub-rule (2) of rule 5 may be terminated by *Government in consultation with the High Court* at any time without notice and without assigning any reason and upon such termination he shall immediately cease to hold such office. Such termination of service shall not be treated as a stigma and shall not have adverse effect on his career in any manner.

11. *Savings.*— (1) The law in force as applicable to Courts shall be applicable also to the evening Courts notified under these Rules.

(2) The jurisdiction of the evening Court to deal with cases specified in rule 3 of these Rules shall be concurrent with the Court.

These rules are issued in consultation with the High Court of Bombay, conveyed vide letter No. Rule/A(SPL) 0803/G/2010/69 dated 2-5-2014 and No. Rule.A(SPL)0803/G/2010/64 dated 22-2-2013 of the Goa Public Service Commission conveyed vide their letter No. Com/II/13/58(1)/2012/835 dated 27-7-2012.

Whereas in exercise of powers conferred under section 244-A of the Goa Panchayat Raj Act, 1994 (Goa Act No. 14 of 1994) the Government of Goa vide Notification No. 25/7/CEV/Vol./2012/5225 dated 03-09-2013 published in Official Gazette, Series I No. 23 dated 05-09-2013 had framed The Deendayal Panchayati Raj Infrastructure Development (Golden Jubilee) Scheme, 2013 (hereinafter referred to as said scheme) for upgrading the infrastructure in the rural areas of Goa.

Now therefore, in pursuance of the provisions of the said section 244-A of the Goa Panchayat Raj Act, 1994 read with section 21 of The General Clauses Act, 1897 (Central Act 10 of 1897), the Government of Goa hereby amends the said scheme, as under:

1. *Amendment of Clause 28 of said scheme.*—  
The following proviso shall be added below  
Clause 28 of the said scheme:—

“Provided that in deserving cases the  
Scrutiny and Sanctioning Committee may  
sanction an amount of upto rupees two  
crores for one infrastructure project with  
prior approval of Finance Department:

Provided further that such cases shall not  
exceed more than 10% of the total proposals  
received under the Scheme.”

The above amendments shall come into force  
on the date of publication of this Notification  
in Official Gazette.

The amendments to the scheme are  
published with the concurrence of the  
Department of Finance, Government of Goa  
conveyed vide U. O. No. 2274/F dated 9-05-2014.

the Recruitment Rules for Group ‘A’ and ‘B’

In the Schedule annexed to the Recruitment  
Rules for various Group ‘A’ and ‘B’ posts under  
the Government of Goa, for the existing entry  
prescribing age limit in the relevant column,  
the following entry shall be substituted,  
namely:—

“Not exceeding 42 years (relaxable for  
Government servants upto five years in  
accordance with the instructions or orders  
issued by the Government)”.

*Note:* (1) This shall not be applicable to Group  
‘A’ and ‘B’ posts wherever the present age limit is  
above 40 years.

(2) This Notification shall come into force from  
the date of its publication in the Official Gazette  
and shall remain in force for a period of one year  
from the date of its commencement.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section  
30 of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act,  
1969 (18 of 1969) the Government of Goa with  
the approval of the Central Government hereby  
makes the following rules to amend the Goa  
Registration of Births and Deaths Rules, 1999,  
namely:—

1. (i) These rules may be called the Goa  
Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment)  
Rules, 2014.

(ii) These rules shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the State of Goa, Goa Registration of Births and Deaths Rules, 1999 (hereinafter called the principal rule).

3. *Rule 10: Period for the purpose of section 14.— (1) Where the birth of any child has been registered without a name, the parent or guardian of such child shall, within 12 months from the date of registration of the birth of child, give information regarding the name of the child to the Registrar either orally or in writing:*

Provided that, if the information is given after the aforesaid period of 12 months, which shall be reckoned:

The sub-rule 1(i & ii) of Rule 10 shall be substituted, namely:—

(i) In case where the registration had been made *Prior* to the date of commencement of the Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Rules 1999, *further five years period from the date of commencement of this rule (i.e. Rules 2014) shall be given. In respect of those cases, where 15 years period from the date of registration has not yet been completed, they shall be allowed to avail the 15 years period or*

(ii) In case where the registration is made *after* the date of commencement of the Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Rules, 2014 the period of 15 years from the date of such registration, subject to the provision of sub-section (4) of section 23, the Registrar shall—

(a) if the register is in his possession forthwith enter the name in the relevant column of the concerned form in the birth register on payment of a late fee of rupees five;

(b) if the register is not in his possession and if the information is given orally, make a report giving necessary particulars, and if the information is given in writing,

forward the same to the officer specified by the State Government in this behalf for making the necessary entry on payment of a late fee of rupees five.

(iii) There will be no change in the provision of sub-rule (2) of Rule 10.

Government of Goa is pleased to make the following scheme and publish the same for the

general information of the public, which shall come into force from the date of publication in the Official Gazette.

*Name of the scheme:* The scheme shall be called "Conduct of Annual Inter-School Tournaments, Deputation of State School Teams for National and International Participation and Hosting of National School Games in the State."

I. *The Objectives of the scheme.*— (A) To organise:— (i) *Primary/Middle School Sports Festival* for students studying in Schools recognized by Education Department from *Std. 1st to Std. 7th and below 13 years.*

(ii) *Mini/Secondary School Sports* as per the Guidelines of the School Games Federation of India (*Each State is an affiliated Member of the School Games Federation of India which is recognized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India*) for students studying in Schools recognized by Education Department from *Std. Vth to Std. Xth and below 17 years.*

(iii) *Higher Secondary School Sports* as per the Guidelines of the School Games Federation of India for students studying in Schools recognized by Education Department in *Std. 11th & Std. 12th and below 19 years.*

(iv) *Inter-School Nehru Hockey Tournament* as per the Guidelines of the Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament Society, New Delhi, in the age group of *U/15 years & U/17 years for Boys and U/17 years for Girls studying upto 12th Std.*

(v) *Inter-School Subroto Mukerjee Football Tournament* as per the guidelines of the Subroto Mukerjee Sports Education Society, New Delhi, for Boys in the age group of *U/14 years and U/17 years and Girls in the age group of U/17 years studying upto 12th Std.*

(B) *To depute the State School teams for.*— (i) National/International School Games Competitions and Camps.

(ii) All India Nehru Hockey Tournament.

(iii) All India Subroto Mukherjee Football Tournament.

(C) *To Host National School Games in the State.*— Each affiliated Unit (i.e. the Department of Sports & Youth Affairs in every State/UT) of the SGFI (School Games Federation of India) has to organize at least one National Event after obtaining Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction of the Government.

## II. *Eligibility.*—

➤ All School students, Boys and Girls, studying from 1<sup>st</sup> Standard to 12th Standard in Schools recognized by the Education Department in Goa.

➤ As per the Guidelines of the School Games Federation of India, the Kendriya Vidyalayas, Navodaya Vidyalayas, CBSC, ICSC and IPSC have their own Sports Control Boards and hence have to participate only through their Boards; they are not eligible to participate in the Department of Sports & Youth Affairs Inter-School Tournaments.

III. *Permissible Activities.*— (1) To provide equipment for the conduct of the tournaments – as per the requirements Game-wise on an Annual Basis.

(2) To provide officials for officiating in the tournaments and make payments towards officiating charges – as per ANNEXURE 'A'.

(3) To provide Kit and Equipment towards conduct of the Pre-National Coaching Camps and participation of the State School Teams for National/International School Games on an Annual basis, Game-wise as per requirements.

IV. *Financial implications towards Organization of.*— A. *Primary/Middle School Sports Festival.*—

➤ Organisation of the Primary/Middle School Sports Festival is an Event organized

by the Department of Sports and Youth Affairs for students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department upto the VIIth Std. and below 13 years in order to tap the talent at a young age and encourage the children to participate in Sports.

➤ The Games and events organized are as per Government approval.

➤ *The Sports events are organized at the Group, Taluka, District and State Level.*

➤ The events are organized at the *Group Level* where Schools in the vicinity of each other are Grouped together to form a Group. There are 183 such Groups spread across 12 Talukas.

➤ The winning participants go on to participate at the Taluka, District and State level.

➤ The State Primary Middle School Sports Festival is held over a period of 2 to 3 days, where the students stay overnight.

➤ The expenditure to be incurred at the Group, Taluka, District and State level shall be enhanced by 10% every 2 years.

## B. *Mini, Secondary School Sports.*—

➤ The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs organizes Inter-School Tournaments in Games approved by Government for students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department in the State from 1st to 10th Std. who are below 17 years.

➤ The Games are organized at the Taluka, District and State level.

➤ The expenditure to be incurred at the Taluka, District and State level shall be enhanced by 10% every 2 years.

## C. *Higher Secondary School Sports.*—

➤ The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs organizes Inter-Higher Secondary

School Tournaments in Games approved by Government for students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department in the State in Std. IXth and XIIth.

➤ The Higher Secondary Schools are divided into 4 Zones; Zone I, Zone II, Zone III and Zone IV.

➤ The Games are organized at the Zonal level, District level and State level.

➤ The Expenditure to be incurred at the Zonal, District and State level shall be enhanced every 2 years by 10%.

*D. Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament.—*

➤ The Department of Sports & Youth Affairs organizes the Nehru Hockey Tournament for students studying in Schools and Higher Secondary Schools in the age category of U/15 years for Boys and U/17 years for both Boys and Girls.

➤ The Tournament is organized at the Taluka, District and State level.

➤ The winning Schools are deputed for their respective Tournaments at the National level.

➤ The Expenditure to be incurred at the Taluka, District and State level shall be enhanced by 10% every 2 years.

*E. Subroto Cup Football Tournament.—*

➤ The Department of Sports & Youth Affairs organizes the Subroto Cup Football Tournament for students studying in Schools and Higher Secondary Schools in the age category of U/14 years for Boys and U/17 years for both Boys and Girls.

➤ The Tournament is organized at the Taluka, District and State level.

➤ The winning Schools are deputed for their respective Tournaments at the National level.

➤ The expenditure to be incurred at the Taluka, District and State level shall be enhanced by 10% every 2 years.

*F. Deputation of the State School Teams for National/International Participation and Camps.—*

➤ The Department of Sports & Youth Affairs deposes the State School Teams both Boys and Girls in the age categories of U/14 years, U/17 years and U/19 years for National School Games organized under the aegis of the School Games Federation of India.

➤ The Department calls for selection trials releasing Press Notes in the local dailies.

➤ Selection trials are conducted by inviting Coaches/Veteran players to conduct the trials independently.

➤ Pre-National Coaching Camps are conducted either on a daily basis or Residential Camps for a min. of 21 days and max. as per requirements.

➤ Kit and Equipment is provided to the selected players during the Camp and for participation at the National level as per requirements.

➤ The Expenditure to be incurred for deputation of the State School Team for National School Games shall be enhanced every 2 years by 10%.

*G. Organization of National School Games in the State.—*

➤ The State being a Unit of the School Games Federation of India is allotted at least one Game in year to organise on behalf of the SGFI.

➤ The expenditure towards hosting a National event will be as per Government approval.

*V. Beneficiaries.— (A) Primary/Middle:—* All students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department from Std. I to Std. VII and below 13 years.

*(B) Mini Secondary:— (i) Mini Sports: All students studying in Schools recognized by*



the Education Department from Std. I to Std. VIII and below 14 years.

(ii) Secondary Sports : All students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department from Std. I to Std. X and below 17 years.

(C) Higher Secondary: All students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department from Std. IX to Std. XII and below 19 years.

(D) Nehru Hockey: All students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department from Std. V to Std. XII and below 17 years.

(E) Subroto Football: All students studying in Schools recognized by the Education Department from Std. V to Std. XII and below 17 years.

VI. Rules and Regulations.— (1) The Rules and Regulations towards organization of the Inter-School Tournaments is as per approval of the School Games Federation of India (SGFI) and circulated from time to time.

(2) The Rules and Regulations towards organization of the Inter-Higher Secondary School Tournaments is as per the circulated Rules to the School from time to time.

(3) Rules and Regulations for the deputation of the State School Teams is as per SGFI guidelines.

(4) The Rules and Regulations for organisation of National School Games in the State are as per SGFI Guidelines.

The Scheme is approved by Finance Department vide their U. O. No. 1400001697, dated 15-9-14.

The Government of Goa is pleased to frame a scheme for disbursement of fuel subsidy to the private bus operators due to their inability to participate in the pass system on account of technical difficulties.

*Preamble.*— Government of Goa, keeping in view contribution of Private Stage Carriage Owners in the public transport system of Goa and their inability to participate in pass system due to technical difficulties, wants to support them by granting them a fuel subsidy of Rs. 3 per kilometer of operational distance.

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (1) This scheme may be called the Goa State Fuel Subsidy to Private Stage Carriage Operators Scheme, 2014.

(2) It shall come in force on the date of its publication in the Official Gazette and will be valid for a period of three years.

2. *Objectives.*— This scheme provides for socio-economic support to entrepreneurs in the trade of operation of stage carriage on intra-State routes.

3. *Scope of the scheme.*— The scheme covers the owners of private buses/minibuses operating on intra-State routes as “stage carriage” as well as those intending to enter the trade for the first time.

The scheme provides for disbursement of fuel subsidy of Rs. 3/- (Rupees three) per kilometer of operational distance.

4. *Conditions.*— The beneficiary under this scheme shall not be entitled for benefits under any other scheme of the Central and State Government. Also, no increase in road fare will be granted in current Financial Year.

5. *Eligibility.*— (1) The applicant under the scheme shall be the owner of the bus/mini-bus.

(2) The bus/minibus of the applicant shall be covered by a valid stage carriage permit to operate on intra-State route.

(3) The bus/minibus of the applicant shall be covered by a valid Fitness Certificate and Insurance Certificate.

(4) The applicant shall produce evidence/ Clearance Certificate of upto date payment of passengers taxes and Road taxes and prosecution clearance in respect of his/her vehicle from concerned authorities.

(5) The applicant shall get the permit/operational kilometers certified by concerned Office of permit issuing authority.

(6) The vehicle shall be operating for more than 27 days a month; and in case kept off road for repairs/maintenance for more than two days, prior intimation to be given to licensing Authority.

6. *Procedure.*— The application for subsidy shall be submitted to the Director of Transport in the prescribed form alongwith bank account details.

7. *Disbursement of subsidy.*— (1) The subsidy amount sanctioned shall be directly credited in the Bank Account of the applicant.

(2) Subsidy applications shall be approved by Committee chaired by the Director of Transport as Chairman, Accounts Officer (Member), Asstt. Director of Transport (HQ) Member.

(3) Any difficulties arising in operation of the scheme shall be within the authority of the above Committee for redressal or removal.

8. *Interpretation.*— If any question arises regarding interpretation of any clause, word, expression of the scheme, the decision shall

lie with the Government, which shall be final and binding on all concerned.

9. *Relaxation.*— The Government shall be empowered to relax any or all clauses or conditions of the scheme in genuine cases to be recorded in writing.

10. *Redressal of Grievances and Disputes.*— Grievances, if any, arising out of the implementation of this scheme, shall be heard and decided by the Director of Transport and the decision of the Director of Transport in this regard shall be final and binding on all concerned.

The Government of Goa is pleased to frame the "Seasonal Pass Scheme for Daily Commuters and Students by Kadamba Transport Corporation Limited, 2014" which will replace the existing "Seasonal Pass Scheme for Daily Commuters and Students by Kadamba Transport Corporation Limited-2012" from 1st November, 2014.

*Preamble.*— Government of Goa has established State Road Transport Undertaking (STU) in October 1980. The aim and object of the State Transport Undertaking was to provide safe and reliable bus transport service to the commuters including the students from remote villages. The concessional travelling service was extended to senior citizens, the physically disabled, the blind, veterans, ladies, cancer patients etc.

Today, due to increase in self owned transport services like motorbikes, cars, etc., there is road congestion resulting in road accidents especially of motorbike riders and private car owners. In addition to the traffic congestion and accidents, there is alarming increase in pollution and parking problems in all the urban areas.

To alleviate the common man from this serious problem, the Government of Goa endeavours to provide concessional public transport to daily commuters and students.

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (i) The scheme shall be called the "Seasonal Pass Scheme for Daily Commuters and Students by Kadamba Transport Corporation Limited-2014".

(ii) The scheme shall come into force from 1st November, 2014.

(iii) The scheme shall be in force up to December, 2017. However Government reserves the right to cancel or modify the scheme at any time without notice.

2. *Objectives.*— The main objectives of the scheme are as follows:—

(i) Concession to daily commuters travelling in buses operated by the Kadamba Transport Corporation Limited.

(ii) Encouraging use of Public Transport system in Goa.

(iii) To provide safe and reliable service and strengthen Public Transport network in urban and rural areas.

(iv) To decongest the road and provide environment friendly service.

3. *Scope of the scheme.*— (i) The scheme shall be applicable to all commuters travelling within the State of Goa.

(ii) The scheme provides for disbursement of subsidy to Kadamba Transport Corporation Ltd., for providing concessional travelling to the commuters, students and other concession holders.

(iii) The scheme provides for concessional passes as below:

A. *Commuters in general:*— (a) Concession of 40% for Weekly Pass.

(b) Concession of 50% for Fortnightly Pass.

(c) Concession of 60% for Monthly, Quarterly, Half yearly and Yearly Pass.

B. *To students and others who are presently eligible for 50% concession:*— (a) Concession of 70% for Weekly Pass.

(b) Concession of 75% for Fortnightly Pass.

(c) Concession of 80% for Monthly, Quarterly, Half yearly and Yearly Pass.

(iv) The concessional pass shall entitle the user to travel during the validity of the pass on any number of occasions on the route or part of the route for which the pass is issued.

(v) Concessional pass shall be issued for a period of One Week, Fortnightly, One Month, Quarterly (3 months), Half yearly (6 months) and Yearly (12 months).

(vi) The concession under concessional pass scheme shall be applicable for all the routes operated by KTCL within the State of Goa only.

4. *Eligibility conditions under the scheme.*—

(a) Regular commuters namely, Government Servants, Industrial Workmen, Ladies, Gents, Students, Senior Citizens, Physically disabled, Businessmen as also Tourists, etc., travelling within the State of Goa shall be eligible for concessional travel under the scheme.

(b) Student means a bonafide student enrolled in any educational institution, college, university, etc.

5. *Quantum of concession.*— (a) Regular commuters shall be provided with a concession as defined under clause 3(iii)(A) of the scheme for travel within the State of Goa.

(b) Bonafide student shall be provided concession as defined under clause 3(iii)(B) of the scheme for travel within the State of Goa.

(c) Concessions to those who are at present eligible for 50% ticket concession shall be provided as defined under clause 3(iii)(B) of the scheme.

6. *Procedure for concessional pass.*— (a) *For the commuters:*—

(1) The applicant shall apply in FORM 'A' annexed herewith along with one time fee of Rs. 20/- (Rupees twenty only) and a passport size photograph of the applicant to the Kadamba Transport Office.

(2) Kadamba Transport Corporation Office after receipt of the application shall issue a Unique Identification Number (U.I.N.) to the applicant having a computer generated 10 digit identification number in form of a card.



(3) A concessional pass with photo of applicant shall be issued on production of card at any ticket counter of the Corporation at the Bus Stands.

(4) The concessional pass issued by the KTCL shall not be valid to be used for any other purpose except for availing the benefit of concessional travelling under the scheme.

(5) The concessional pass to the bonafide students shall be issued as per the validity of the Identity Card issued by the respective Institutions.

(b) *For the State Transport Undertaking (KTCL):—*

(1) The route-wise and stage-wise chart will be prepared to identify the Concessional Pass (C.P) amount which will be computer generated.

(2) Kilometer-wise C.P. amount will include chargeable fare as per the eligible concession.

(3) Once the pass is issued to the commuters the subsidy amount will be generated automatically for further pass issued on the route identified.

(4) Consolidated list/details of pass with subsidy amount shall be claimed by Kadamba Transport Corporation Ltd. from the Government.

(5) The Kadamba Transport Corporation shall issue a Zero value ticket (separate Zero value ticket for each route) to the eligible concessional pass holders during their actual travelling within the State of Goa. The travel shall be considered valid/ authorised only if the seasonal pass and Zero value ticket is produced on demand. The subsidy claim shall be submitted to the Department on quarterly basis. The amount of subsidy for the respective quarter shall be on the basis of the presumption of 75% travelling by the eligible concessional pass

holders during the quarter to be reimbursed on the percentage as indicated under clause 7(3) of the scheme. The data of Zero value tickets will be submitted every month.

(6) Calculation of concession shall be on the basis of the period of the concessional pass issued for travelling.

*7. Financial implication and disbursement of subsidy by the Department.—* (1) The subsidy to the extent of actual concession given by the Kadamba Transport Corporation Ltd., to the pass holder shall be claimed by the Corporation on quarterly basis after completion of each quarter based on the basis of the presumption of 75% travelling during the quarter by the eligible concessional pass holders as per the percentage as detailed below:—

(a) 25% of sale value shall be the subsidy reimbursement on 40% concession and 150% of sale value shall be the subsidy reimbursement on 70% concession on the Weekly Pass.

(b) 50% of sale value shall be the subsidy reimbursement on 50% concession and 200% of sale value shall be the subsidy reimbursement on 75% concession on the Fortnightly Pass.

(c) 87.5% of sale value shall be the subsidy reimbursement on 60% concession and 275% of sale value shall be the subsidy reimbursement on 80% concession on the Monthly, Quarterly, Half Yearly and Yearly Pass.

(2) Department of Transport shall reimburse the subsidy claim once claim is received from the Corporation after completion of each quarter.

(3) The Finance Department shall check the correctness and authenticity of such claim after periodic interval as deemed fit by the Finance Department.

(4) An additional amount of Rs. 10.00 Cr. shall be released to KTCL for operating the scheme which will be recovered on completion of recovery as indicated at sub-clause (1) of the Seasonal Pass Scheme for Daily Commuters and Students by Kadamba Transport Corporation Limited-2012, in the same manner as stipulated in sub-clause (1) of that scheme.

8. *Validity and Review.*— The validity of the scheme is extended upto December, 2017 and review shall be due in November, 2017.

9. *Relaxation.*— The Government shall be empowered to relax any or all clauses or conditions of the scheme in genuine cases to be recorded in writing.

10. *Interpretation.*— If any question arises regarding interpretation of any clause, word, expression of the scheme, the decision shall

lie with the Government, which shall be final and binding on all concerned.

11. *Redressal of Grievances and Disputes.*— Grievances, if any, arising out of the implementation of this scheme, shall be heard and decided by the Director of Transport and the decision of the Director of Transport in this regard shall be final and binding on all concerned.
